- Using anatomical landmarks to objectively balance hooves.
- Safe handling of horses while trimming.
- Correct use of farrier tools.
- A generic recipe for basic maintenance trimming.
- Trade secrets that make a hard job easier.
- Latest and greatest in sustainable hoof protection that doesn't affect hoof function (eg. boots, tips, polyshoes).
